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

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SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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STOCKS OF DAIRY and POULTRY PRODUCTS - January 1, 1960

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on January 1, 1960 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 104,144,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 75,539,000 lb. while dairy factories held 28,535,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 10.4 million pounds. The five year average 1955-59 of January 1 stocks is 88,687,000 lb. The December 1959 "out-of-storage" movement was 12.0 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 12.9 million pounds last year.

CHEDDAR CHEESE

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 52,489,000 lb. consisting of 52,033,000 lb. Canadian and 456,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand on January 1, 1960. The summary total was higher than last year by 5.7 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 817 thousand pounds for December 1959.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 44,598,000 lb. which was a decrease of 3.2 million pounds from last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for December 1959 was 10.3 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim-milk powder, amounted to 21,767,000 lb., a decrease of 55.5 million pounds from last year and an increase of 96 thousand pounds over last month.

EGGS

The January 1, 1960 report shows 10,000 cases of cold storage eggs, 72,000 cases of fresh eggs and 2,000 cases shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 4,604,000 lb. being 1.6 million pounds lower than the 1959 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for December 1959 was 1.0 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 822 thousand pounds during December 1959.

POULTRY MEAT

The summary total of Dressed and Eviscerated poultry meat stocks on January 1, 1960 was lower than last year by 21.4 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 21.7 million pounds is shown for the month of December 1959. By kinds, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stock, the latter in brackets, were; Chicken 1,488,000 lb. (4,071,000) lb., Fowl 2,145,000 lb. (4,034,000) lb. and turkey 1,077,000 lb. (10,336,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received in time. There were 25,000 lb. of poultry meat in transit on January 1, 1960.
