#### SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

#### STOCKS OF DAIRY and POULTRY PRODUCTS

October 1, 1960

#### CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on October 1, 1960 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 138,517,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 103,579,000 lb. while dairy factories held 34,798,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 4.7 million pounds. The five year average 1955-59 of October 1 stocks is 166,694,000 lb. The September 1960 "into-storage" movement was 2.9 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 8.7 million pounds last year.

#### CHEDDAR CHEESE

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 63,965,000 lb. consisting of 63,813,000 lb. Canadian and 152,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand on October 1, 1960. The summary total was higher than last year by 7.6 million pounds and showed an "into-storage" movement of 3.4 million pounds for September 1960.

#### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 64,057,000 lb. which was a decrease of 2.8 million pounds from last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for September 1960 was 190 thousand pounds. Stocks of the chief by-products, skim-milk powder, amounted to 28,613,000 lb., a decrease of 22.8 million pounds from last year and a decrease of 836 thousand pounds from last month.

#### EGGS

The October 1, 1960 report shows 22,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 39,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were 1,000 cases shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 8,594,000 lb. being 201 thousand pounds lower than the 1959 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for September 1960 was 178 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 1.5 million pounds during September 1959.

#### POULTRY MEAT

The summary total of Dressed and Eviscerated poultry meat stocks of October 1, 1960 was lower than last year by 1.4 million pounds. An "intostorage" movement of 9.1 million pounds is shown for the month of September 1960. By kinds, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stock, the latter in brackets, were: Chicken 804,000 lb. (3,223,000) lb., Fowl 2,390,000 lb. (3,250,000) lb. and turkey 853,000 lb. (11,815,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 225,000 lb. of poultry meat in transit on October 1, 1960.


