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SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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STOCKS OF DAIRY and POULTRY PRODUCTS

November 1, 1960

CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of business on November 1, 1960, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 134,251,000 lb. Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 101,238,000 lb. while dairy factories held 32,908,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 2.1 million pounds. The five year average 1955-59 of November 1 stocks is 116,349,000 lb. The October 1960 "out-of-storage" movement was 4.4 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 1.6 million pounds last year.

CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 61,108,000 lb. consisting of 60,804,000 lb. Canadian and 304,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand on November 1, 1960. The summary total was higher than last year by 5.0 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 3.3 million pounds for October 1960.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 61,687,000 lb. which was decrease of 4.0 million pounds from last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for October 1960 was 2.4 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-products, skim-milk powder, amounted to 26,838,000 lb., a decrease of 8.0 million pounds from last year and a decrease of 2.0 million pounds from last month.

EGGS:

The November 1, 1960 report shows 7,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 34,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were 3,000 cases shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 8,175,000 lb. being 188 thousand pounds higher than the 1959 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for October 1960 was 446 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 406 thousand pounds during October 1959.

POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of Dressed and Eviscerated poultry meat stocks of November 1, 1960 was higher than last year by 747 thousand pounds. An "into-storage" movement of 10.9 million pounds is shown for the month of October 1960. By kinds, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stock, the latter in brackets, were: Chicken 1,133,000 lb. (4,707,000) lb., Fowl 3,013,000 lb. (4,260,000) lb. and turkey 1,332,000 lb. (18,247,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 325,000 lb. of poultry meat in transit on November 1, 1960.
