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SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

March 1, 1960

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on March 1, 1960 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 84,561,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 60,799,000 lb. while dairy factories held 23,587,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 13.6 million pounds. The five year average 1955-59 of March 1 stocks is 64,060,-000 lb. The February 1960 "out-of-storage" movement was 11.1 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 11.4 million pounds last year.

CHEESE

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 44,367,000 lb. consisting of 44,139,000 lb. Canadian and 228,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand on March 1, 1960. The summary total was higher than last year by 5.9 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 5.1 million pounds for February 1960.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 14,026,000 lb. which was a decrease of 12.0 million pounds from last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for February 1960 was 9.3 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-products, skim-milk powder, amounted to 15,821,000 lb., a decrease of 55.3 million pounds from last year and a decrease of 1.5 million pounds from last month.

EGGS

The March 1, 1960 reports shows 58,000 cases of cold storage eggs, 52,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were no shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 5,309,000 lb. being 240 thousand pounds lower than the 1959 figures. The "into-storage" movement for February 1960 was 270 thousand pounds as compared with an opposite movement of 414 thousand pounds during February 1960.

POULTRY MEAT

The summary total of Dressed and Eviscerated poultry meat stocks on March 1, 1960 was lower than last year by 18.8 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 3.4 million pounds is shown for the month of February 1960. By kinds, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stock, the latter in brackets, were; Chicken 1,032,000 lb. (3,749,000) lb., Fowl 1,650,000 lb. (3,065,000) lb. and turkey 883,000 lb. (8,824,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received in time. There were no stocks of poultry meat in transit on March 1, 1960.


