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SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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STOCKS OF DAIRY and POULTRY PRODUCTS

July 1, 1960

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on July 1, 1960 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 113,371,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 81,805,000 lb. while dairy factories held 31,426,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 20.1 million pounds. The five year average 1955-59 of July 1 stocks is 79,774,000 lb. The June 1960 "into-storage" movement was 22.0 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 21.7 million pounds last year. The Agricultural Stabilization Board has initiated the announced programme of converting some stored butter to butter oil and as of July 1 butter oil stocks amounted to about 619 thousand pounds.

CHEDDAR CHEESE

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 53,155,000 lb. consisting of 52,661,000 lb. Canadian and 494,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand on July 1, 1960. The summary total was higher than last year by 13.0 million pounds and showed an "into-storage" movement of 8.8 million pounds for June 1960.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 47,112,000 lb. which was a decrease of 1.3 million pounds from last year. The "into-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for June 1960 was 15.6 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-products, skim-milk powder, amounted to 29,306,000 lb., a decrease of 36.0 million pounds from last year and an increase of 6.2 million pounds over last month.

EGGS

The July 1, 1960 report shows 124,000 cases of cold storage eggs, 57,000 cases of fresh eggs and 2,000 cases shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 8,012,000 lb. being 1.7 million pounds lower than the 1959 figures. The "into-storage" movement for June 1960 was 1.7 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 1.8 million pounds during June 1959.

POULTRY MEAT

The summary total of Dressed and Eviscerated poultry meat stocks on July 1, 1960 was lower than last year by 8.4 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 843 thousand pounds is shown for the month of June 1960. By kinds, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stock, the latter in brackets, were: Chicken 509,000 lb. (1,952,000) lb., Fowl 1,408,000 lb. (2,029,000) lb. and turkey 298,000 lb. (4,120,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received in time. There were no stocks of poultry meat in transit on July 1, 1960.
