

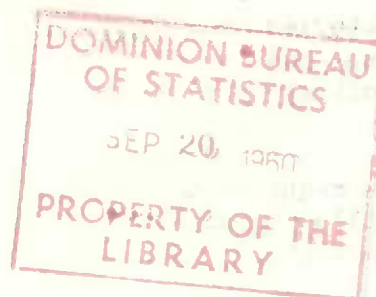

SEPTEMBER 1960

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SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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STOCKS OF DAIRY and POULTRY PRODUCTS

September 1, 1960

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on September 1, 1960 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 134,765,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 101,328,000 lb. while dairy factories held 33,332,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 9.7 million pounds. The five year average 1955-59 of September 1 stocks is 108,943,000 lb. The August 1960 "into-storage" movement was 7.7 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 13.3 million pounds last year.

CHEDDAR CHEESE

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 60,623,000 lb. consisting of 60,231,000 lb. Canadian and 342,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand on September 1, 1960. The summary total was higher than last year by 10.2 million pounds and showed an "into-storage" movement of 2.5 million pounds for August 1960.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 64,247,000 lb. which was an increase of 933 thousand pounds over last year. The "into-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for August 1960 was 7.5 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-products, skim-milk powder, amounted to 29,390,000 lb., a decrease of 26.4 million pounds from last year and a decrease of 1.6 million pounds from last month.

EGGS

The September 1, 1960 report shows 63,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 43,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were no shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 8,780,000 lb. being 1.1 million pounds lower than the 1959 figures. The "into-storage" movement for August 1960 was 347 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 508 thousand pounds during August 1959.

POULTRY MEAT

The summary total of Dressed and Eviscerated poultry meat stocks of September 1, 1960 was lower the last year by 3.0 million pounds. An "into-storage" movement of 3.7 million pounds is shown for the month of August 1960. By kinds, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stock, the latter in brackets, were: Chicken 512,000 lb. (2,498,000) lb., Fowl 1,962,000 lb. (2,900,000) lb. and turkey 409,000 lb. (5,731,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received in time. There were 50,000 lb. of poultry meat in transit on September 1, 1960.
