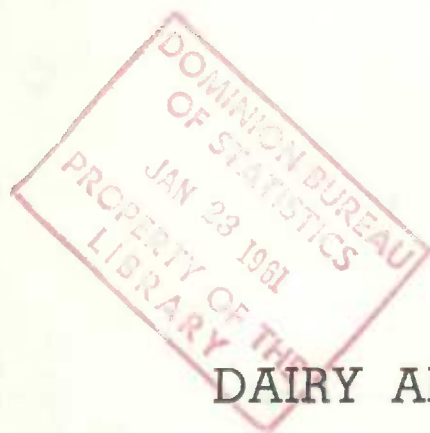

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SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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STOCKS OF DAIRY and POULTRY PRODUCTS

January 1, 1961

CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of business on January 1, 1961, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 113,934,000 lb. Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 86,717,000 lb. while dairy factories held 27,057,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 8.2 million pounds. The five year average 1956-60 of January 1 stocks is 91,627,000 lb. The December 1960 "out-of-storage" movement was 11.5 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 10.4 million pounds last year.

CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 55,265,000 lb. consisting of 54,999,000 lb. Canadian and 266,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand on January 1, 1961. The summary total was higher than last year by 2.7 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 2.2 million pounds for December 1960.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 45,453,000 lb. which was an increase of 855 thousand pounds over last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for December 1960 was 8.2 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-products, skim-milk powder, amounted to 23,992,000 lb., an increase of 2.1 million pounds over last year and a decrease of 642 thousand pounds from last month.

EGGS:

The January 1, 1961 report shows 2,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 52,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were 1,000 cases of shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 5,912,000 lb. being 1.3 million pounds higher than the 1960 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for December 1960 was 1.0 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 984 thousand pounds during December 1959.

POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of Dressed and Eviscerated poultry meat stocks of January 1, 1961 was higher than last year by 1.3 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 21.4 million pounds is shown for the month of December 1960. By kinds, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stock, the latter in brackets, were: Chicken 1,230,000 lb. (5,136,000) lb., Fowl 3,360,000 lb. (4,380,000) lb. and turkey 767,000 lb. (9,313,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were no stocks of poultry meat in transit on January 1, 1961.
