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## SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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## STOCKS OF DAIRY and POULTRY PRODUCTS

October 1, 1961

### CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of business on October 1, 1961 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 158,590,000 lb. Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 117,705,000 lb. while dairy factories held 40,815,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 19.6 million pounds. The five year average 1956-60 of October 1 stocks is 119,182,000 lb. The September 1961 "into-storage" movement was 6.2 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 2.7 million pounds last year.

### CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 70,694,000 lb. consisting of 70,542,000 lb. Canadian and 152,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand on October 1, 1961. The summary total was higher than last year by 6.1 million pounds and showed an "into-storage" movement of 1.3 million pounds for September 1961.

### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 81,070,000 lb. which was an increase of 17.0 million pounds over last year. The "into-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for September 1961 was 2.3 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-products, skim-milk powder, amounted to 50,979,000 lb. an increase of 22.1 million pounds over last year and a decrease of 158 thousand pounds from last month.

### EGGS:

The October 1, 1961 report shows 7,000 cases of cold storage eggs, 42,000 cases of fresh eggs and 2,000 cases of shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 4,789,000 lb. being 3.9 million pounds lower than the 1960 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement of September 1961 was 551 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 95 thousand pounds during September 1960.

### POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at October 1, 1961 was higher than last year by 4.0 million pounds. An "into-storage" movement of 8.8 million pounds is shown for the month of September 1961. By kinds, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stock, the latter in brackets, were Chicken 882,000 lb. (5,306,000) lb., Fowl 2,005,000 lb. (3,806,000) lb. and Turkey 680,000 lb. (13,114,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 325,000 lb. of poultry meat reported in transit on October 1, 1961.
