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SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

December 1, 1961

CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of business on December 1, 1961 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 145,447,000 lb. Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 105,702,000 lb. while dairy factories held 39,710,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 20.0 million pounds. The five year average 1956-60 of December 1 stocks is 106,952,000 lb. The November 1961 "out-of-storage" movement was 14.3 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 9.3 million pounds last year.

CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 66,685,000 lb. consisting of 66,533,000 lb. Canadian and 152,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand on December 1, 1961. The summary total was higher than last year by 9.2 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 4.7 million pounds for November 1961.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 68,950,000 lb. which was an increase of 15.3 million pounds over last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for November 1961 was 12.1 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-products, skim-milk powder, amounted to 35,217,000 lb. an increase of 10.5 million pounds over last year and a decrease of 18.5 million pounds from last month.

EGGS:

The December 1, 1961 report shows 1,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 34,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were no shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 3,216,000 lb. being 3.7 million pounds lower than the 1960 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement of November 1961 was 1.1 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 1.2 million pounds during November 1960.

POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at December 1, 1961 was higher than last year by 16.5 million pounds. An "into-storage" movement of 16.0 million pounds is shown for the month of November 1961. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stock, the latter in brackets, were Chicken 1,554,000 lb. (7,789,000) lb., Fowl 3,083,000 lb. (6,342,000) lb. and Turkey 2,683,000 (39,767,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 250,000 lb. of poultry meat reported in transit on December 1, 1961.

NOTE:

A number of poultry killing and processing plants and some storage premises not previously listed for reporting the stocks, reported their holdings for the first time as of November 1 this year. Therefore stock data for this month are not fully comparable with data for the corresponding month last year. (See footnote page 8.)
