

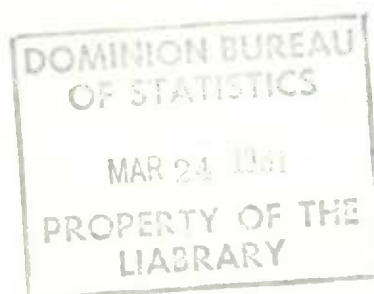

SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

STOCKS OF DAIRY and POULTRY PRODUCTS

March 1, 1961

CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of business on March 1, 1961, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 92,800,000 lb. Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 72,197,000 lb. while dairy factories held 20,288,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 8.2 million pounds. The five year average 1956-60 of March 1 stocks is 67,191,000 lb. The February 1961 "out-of-storage" movement was 11.2 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 10.9 million pounds last year

CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 45,532,000 lb. consisting of 45,076,000 lb. Canadian and 456,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand on March 1, 1961. The summary total was higher than last year by 31 thousand pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 4.8 million pounds for February 1961.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 26,488,000 lb. which was an increase of 12.5 million pounds over last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for February 1961 was 8.4 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-products, skim-milk powder, amounted to 21,470,000 lb., an increase of 5.6 million pounds over last year and a decrease of 1.6 million pounds from last month.

EGGS:

The March 1, 1961 report shows 8,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 45,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were no shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 5,329,000 lb. being 21 thousand pounds higher than the 1960 figures. The "into-storage" movement for February 1961 was 111 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 246 thousand pounds during February 1960.

POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of Dressed and Eviscerated poultry meat stocks of March 1, 1961 was higher than last year by 4.3 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 2.1 million pounds is shown for the month of February 1961. By kinds, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stock, the latter in brackets, were Chicken 865,000 lb. (5,246,000) lb., Fowl 3,354,000 lb. (4,215,000) lb. and turkey 624,000 lb. (9,420,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 50,000 lb. of poultry meat in transit on March 1, 1961.
