

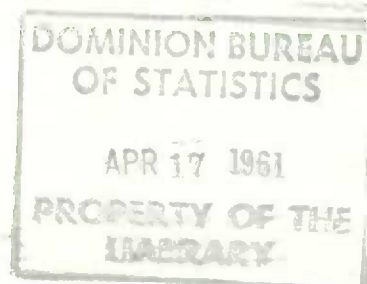

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SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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STOCKS OF DAIRY and POULTRY PRODUCTS

April 1, 1961

CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of business on April 1, 1961, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 83,036,000 lb. Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 64,545,000 lb. while dairy factories held 18,331,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 6.4 million pounds. The five year average 1956-60 of April 1 stocks is 56,931,000 lb. The March 1961 "out-of-storage" movement was 9.5 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 8.0 million pounds last year.

CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 42,470,000 lb. consisting of 42,318,000 lb. Canadian and 152,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand on April 1, 1961. The summary total was lower than last year by 341 thousand pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 3.1 million pounds for March 1961.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 24,078,000 lb. which was an increase of 12.6 million pounds over last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for March 1961 was 2.4 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-products, skim-milk powder, amounted to 20,328,000 lb., an increase of 4.7 million pounds over last year and a decrease of 1.1 million pounds from last month.

EGGS:

The April 1, 1961 report shows 9,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 41,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were 2,000 cases of shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 4,438,000 lb. being 747 thousand pounds lower than the 1960 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for March 1961 was 864 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 123 thousand pounds during March 1960.

POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of Dressed and Eviscerated poultry meat stocks of April 1, 1961 was higher than last year by 3.1 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 4.6 million pounds is shown for the month of March 1961. By kinds, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stock, the latter in brackets, were Chicken 748,000 lb. (4,732,000) lb., Fowl 2,152,000 lb. (3,838,000) lb. and Turkey 466,000 lb. (7,435,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were no stocks of poultry meat reported in transit on April 1, 1961.
