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## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

### Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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# REMARKS ON THE

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## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

October 1, 1962

### CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of October 1962 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 156,011,000 lb. Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 111,862,000 lb. while dairy factories held 44,114,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 2.1 million pounds. The five year average 1957-61 of October 1 stocks is 126,425,000 lb. The September 1962 "into-storage" movement was 10.3 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 6.0 million pounds last year.

### CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 61,957,000 lb. consisting of 61,729,000 lb. Canadian and 228,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand October 1, 1962. The summary total was lower than last year by 9.8 million pounds and showed an "into-storage" movement of 2.6 million pounds for September 1962.

### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 65,179,000 lb. which was a decrease of 15.9 million pounds from last year. The "into-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for September 1962 was 2.2 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-products, skim-milk powder, amounted to 54,951,000 lb. an increase of 3.0 million pounds over last year and an increase of 7.6 million pounds over last month.

### EGGS:

The October 1, 1962 report shows 11,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 42,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were no shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 6,922,000 lb. being 2.1 million pounds higher than the 1961 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement of September 1962 was 438 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 546 thousand pounds during September 1961.

### POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at October 1, 1962 was lower than last year by 1.9 million pounds. An "into-storage" movement of 7.8 million pounds is shown for the month of September 1962. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stock the latter in brackets, were Chicken 499,000 lb. (3,265,000) lb., Fowl 796,000 lb. (2,025,000) lb. and Turkey 255,000 lb. (18,322,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 225,000 lb. of poultry meat reported in transit on October 1, 1962.

### NOTE:

A number of poultry killing and processing plants and some storage premises not previously listed for reporting the stocks, have been added to the list of reporting firms since October 1961. Therefore current stock data are not fully comparable with data for the corresponding month last year. (See Footnote Page 8).
