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## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

### Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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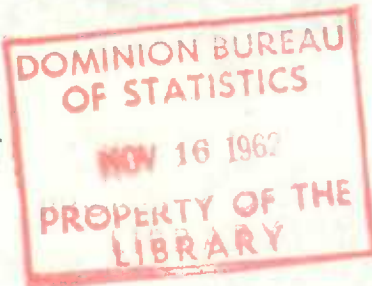
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## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

November 1, 1962

### CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of November 1962 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 158,167,000 lb. Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 112,104,000 lb. while dairy factories held 45,958,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 734 thousand pounds. The five year average 1957-61 of November 1 stocks is 125,755,000 lb. The October 1962 "into-storage" movement was 2.6 million pounds as compared with an opposite movement of 635 thousand pounds last year.

### CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 61,135,000 lb. consisting of 60,603,000 lb. Canadian and 532,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at November 1, 1962. The summary total was lower than last year by 10.3 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 1.2 million pounds for October 1962.

### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 60,632,000 lb. which was a decrease of 20.4 million pounds from last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for October 1962 was 5.7 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-products, skim-milk powder, amounted to 58,192,000 lb. an increase of 4.5 million pounds over last year and an increase of 2.7 million pounds over last month.

### EGGS:

The November 1, 1962 report shows 8,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 36,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were no shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 6,531,000 lb. being 2.2 million pounds higher than the 1961 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement of October 1962 was 454 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 473 thousand pounds during October 1961.

### POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at November 1, 1962 was lower than last year by 7.5 million pounds. An "into-storage" movement of 12.1 million pounds is shown for the month of October 1962. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stock the latter in brackets, were Chicken 540,000 lb. (4,168,000) lb., Fowl 1,534,000 lb. (2,571,000) lb. and Turkey 461,000 lb. (29,685,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 75,000 lb. of poultry meat reported in transit on November 1, 1962.
