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## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

### Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

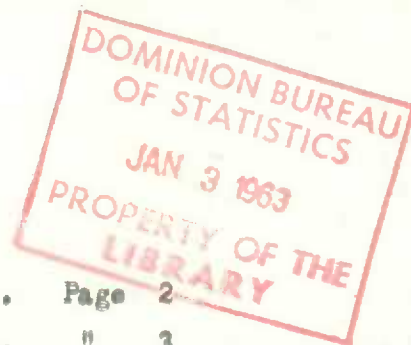
Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

December 1, 1962

### CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of December 1962 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 151,043,000 lb. Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 105,058,000 lb. while dairy factories held 45,985,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 7.5 million pounds. The five year average 1957-61 of December 1 stocks is 114,710,000 lb. The November 1962 "out-of-storage" movement was 6.6 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 13.9 million pounds last year.

### CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 53,686,000 lb. consisting of 52,926,000 lb. Canadian and 760,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at December 1, 1962. The summary total was lower than last year 13.1 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 7.5 million pounds for November 1962.

### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 46,675,000 lb. which was a decrease of 22.3 million pounds from last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for November 1962 was 14.0 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-products, skim-milk powder, amounted to 54,631,000 lb. an increase of 19.3 million pounds over last year and a decrease of 4.6 million pounds from last month.

### EGGS:

The December 1, 1962 report shows 6,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 34,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were 2,000 cases of shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 5,150,000 lb. being 1.9 million pounds higher than the 1961 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement of November 1962 was 1.5 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 1.1 million pounds during November 1961.

### POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at December 1, 1962 was lower than last year by 4.7 million pounds. An "into-storage" movement of 18.4 million pounds is shown for the month of November 1962. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stock the latter in brackets, were Chicken 542,000 lb. (4,717,000) lb., Fowl 1,302,000 lb. (3,265,000) lb. and Turkey 678,000 lb. (46,046,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 250,000 lb. of poultry meat reported in transit on December 1, 1962.
