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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS FEBRUARY 1962

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SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

Pebruary 1, 1962

CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of business on February 1, 1962 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 112,622,000 lb. Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 83,092,000 lb. while dairy factories held 29,530,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 8.7 million pounds. The five year average 1957-61 of February 1 stocks is 82,535,000 lb. The January 1962 "out-of-storage" movement was 14.2 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 10.0 million pounds last year.

CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 59,994,000 lb. consisting of 59,918,000 lb. Canadian and 76,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand on February 1, 1962. The summary total was higher than last year by 8.7 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 4.0 million pounds for January 1962.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 49,023,000 lb. which was an increase of 14.2 million pounds over last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for January 1962 was 11.1 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-products, skim-milk powder, amounted to 26,352,000 lb. an increase of 4.7 million pounds over last year and a decrease of 4.0 million pounds from last month.

BGGS:

The February 1, 1962 report shows 4,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 53,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were no shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 4,028,000 lb. being 1.2 million pounds lower than the 1961 figures. The "into-storage" movement of January 1962 was 1.1 million pounds as compared with an opposite movement of 584 thousand pounds during January 1961.

POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at February 1, 1962 was higher than last year by 11.2 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 12 thousand pounds is shown for the month of January 1962. By kind, The dressed and eviscerated quantities in stock, the latter in brackets, were Chicken 991,000 lb. (7,580,000) lb., Fowl 2,560,000 lb. (5,770,000) and Turkey 924,000 lb. (18,837,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 150,000 lb. of poultry meat reported in transit on February 1, 1962.

NOTE:

A number of poultry killing and processing plants and some storage premises not previously listed for reporting the stocks, reported their holdings for the first time as of November 1, 1961. Therefore stock data for this month are not fully comparable with data for the corresponding month last year. (See footnote page 8.) in cold storages and dairy factories in Canada - February 1, 1962
