STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

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SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

April 1, 1962

CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of business on April 1, 1962 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 78,524,000 lb. Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 55,420,000 lb. while dairy factories held 23,034,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 4.7 million pounds. The five year average 1957-61 of April 1 stocks is 60,573,000 lb. The March 1962 "out-of-storage" movement was 16.1 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 9.2 million pounds last year.

CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 52,341,000 lb. consisting of 52,265,000 lb. Canadian and 76,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand on April 1, 1962. The summary total was higher than last year by 9.3 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 4.5 million pounds for March 1962.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 24,649,000 lb. which was an increase of 571 thousand pounds over last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for March 1962 was 10.9 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-products, skim-milk powder, amounted to 19,963,000 lb. a decrease of 740 thousand pounds from last year and a decrease of 2.9 million pounds from last month.

EGGS:

The April 1, 1962 report shows 9,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 40,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were no shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 4,900,000 lb. being 451 thousand pounds higher than the 1961 figures. The "into-storage" movement of March 1962 was 132 thousand pounds as compared with an opposite movement of 857 thousand pounds during March 1961.

POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at April 1, 1962 was higher than last year by 11.7 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 3.9 million pounds is shown for the month of March 1962. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stock, the latter in brackets were Chicken 858,000 lb. (5,655,000) lb., Fowl 2,914,000 lb. (4,505,000) lb. and Turkey 827,000 lb. (15,407,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 50,000 lb. of poultry meat reported in transit on April 1, 1962.

NOTE:

A number of poultry killing and processing plants and some storage premises not previously listed for reporting the stocks, have been added to the list of reporting firms since October 1961. Therefore current stock data are not fully comparable with data for the corresponding month last year. (See footnote Page 8)
