## SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

June 1, 1962

### CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of business on June 1, 1962 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 87,683,000 lb. Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 60,187,000 lb. while dairy factories held 27,496,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 8.2 million pounds. The five year average 1957-61 of June 1 stocks is 69,404,000 lb. The May 1962 "into-storage" movement was 5.7 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 10.4 million pounds last year.

### CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 47,971,000 lb. consisting of 47,401,000 lb. Canadian and 570,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand on June 1, 1962. The summary total was higher than last year by 992 thousand pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 167 thousand pounds for May 1962.

### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 28,948,000 lb. which was a decrease of 6.9 million pounds from last year. The "into-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for May 1962 was 3.8 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-products, skim-milk powder, amounted to 22,192,000 lb. a decrease of 7.2 million pounds from last year and an increase of 751 thousand pounds over last month.

### EGGS:

The June 1, 1962 report shows 35,000 cases of cold storage eggs, 76,000 cases of fresh eggs and 2,000 cases of shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 5,681,000 lb. being 602 thousand pounds higher than the 1961 figures. The "into-storage" movement of May 1962 was 828 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 760 thousand pounds during May 1961.

### POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at June 1, 1962 was higher than last year by 6.1 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 3.3 million pounds is shown for the month of May 1962. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stock, the latter in brackets were Chicken 591,000 lb. (4,258,000) lb., Fowl 1,449,000 lb. (2,915,000) lb. and Turkey 269,000 lb. (10,895,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 100,000 lb. of poultry meat reported in transit on June 1, 1962.

### NOTE:

A number of poultry killing and processing plants and some storage premises not previously listed for reporting the stocks, have been added to the list of reporting firms since October 1961. Therefore current stock data are not fully comparable with data for the corresponding month last year. (See Footnote Page 8)
