SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

September 1, 1962

CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of September, 1962 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 144,932,000 lb. Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 105,443,000 lb. while dairy factories held 39,454,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 7.1 million pounds. The five year average 1957-61 of September 1 stocks is 119,704,000 lb. The August, 1962 "into-storage" movement was 14.4 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 11.8 million pounds last year.

CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 59,300,000 lb. consisting of 58,958,000 lb. Canadian and 342,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand September 1, 1962. The summary total was lower than last year by 10.3 million pounds and showed an "into-storage" movement of 2.4 million pounds for August, 1962.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 62,964,000 lb. which was a decrease of 15.8 million pounds from last year. The "into-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for August, 1962 was 4.7 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-products, skim-milk powder, amounted to 46,569,000 lb. a decrease of 4.2 million pounds from last year and an increase of 5.4 million pounds over last month.

EGGS:

The September 1, 1962 report shows 26,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 45,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were 2,000 cases shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 7,304,000 lb. being 2.0 million pounds higher than the 1961 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement of August, 1962 was 418 thousand pounds as compared with an opposite movement of 88 thousand pounds during August, 1961.

POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at September 1, 1962 was lower than last year by 546 thousand pounds. An "into-storage" movement of 2.2 million pounds is shown for the month of August, 1962. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stock, the latter in brackets, were Chicken 481,000 lb. (2,985,000) lb., Fowl 651,000 lb. (1,623,000) lb. and Turkey 198,000 lb. (11,503,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 100,000 lb. of poultry meat reported in transit on September 1, 1962.

NOTE:

A number of poultry killing and processing plants and some storage premises not previously listed for reporting the stocks, have been added to the list of reporting firms since October 1961. Therefore current stock data are not fully comparable with data for the corresponding month last year. (See Footnote Page 8).
