## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

### Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

January 1, 1963

### CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of January 1963 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 136,855,000 lb. Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 96,805,000 lb. while dairy factories held 39,945,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 10.2 million pounds. The five year average 1958-62 of January 1 stocks is 101,969,000 lb. The December 1962 "out-of-storage" movement was 11.9 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 16.9 million pounds last year.

### CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 52,065,000 lb. consisting of 51,533,000 lb. Canadian and 532,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at January 1, 1963. The summary total was lower than last year 11.9 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 2.1 million pounds for December 1962.

### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 39,374,000 lb. which was a decrease of 20.8 million pounds from last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for December 1962 was 7.3 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by products, skim-milk powder, amounted to 52,744,000 lb. an increase of 22.9 million pounds over last year and a decrease of 2.1 million pounds from last month.

### EGGS:

The January 1, 1963 report shows 3,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 43,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were no shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 4,563,000 lb. being 1.6 million pounds higher than the 1962 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement of December 1962 was 532 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 254 thousand pounds during December 1961.

### POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at January 1, 1963 was lower than last year by 6.4 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 25.2 million pounds is shown for the month of December 1962. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stock the latter in brackets, were Chicken 503,000 lb. (3,958,000) lb., Fowl 884,000 lb. (2,391,000) lb. and Turkey 334,000 lb. (25,575,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were no stocks of poultry meat reported in transit on January 1, 1963.
