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## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

### Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.


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## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

October 1, 1963

### CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of October 1963 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 166,599,000 lb. Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 114,277,000 lb. while dairy factories held 52,217,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 11.1 million pounds. The five year average 1958-62 of October 1 stocks is 139,542,000 lb. The September 1963 "into-storage" movement was 7.0 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 10.1 million pounds last year. Stocks of butter oil amounted to 81,667 thousand pounds.

### CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 68,612,000 lb. consisting of 68,384,000 lb. Canadian and 228,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at October 1, 1963. The summary total was higher than last year by 6.2 million pounds and showed an "into-storage" movement of 5.3 million pounds for September 1963.

### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 60,238,000 lb. which was a decrease of 6.1 million pounds from last year. The "into-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for September 1963 was 3.8 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by product, skim milk powder, amounted to 33,620,000 lb. a decrease of 21.9 million pounds from last year and 2.0 million pounds from last month.

### EGGS:

The October 1, 1963 report shows 8,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 34,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were no shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 6,621,000 lb. being 390 thousand pounds lower than the 1962 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for September 1963 was 13 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 386 thousand pounds during September 1962.

### POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at October 1, 1963 was higher than last year by 10.2 million pounds. An "into-storage" movement of 11.3 million pounds is shown for the month of September 1963. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks, the latter in brackets, were Chicken 545,000 lb. (7,313,000) lb., Fowl 729,000 lb. (4,162,000) lb., and Turkey 118,000 lb. (24,459,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 25,000 lb. of poultry meat reported in transit on October 1, 1963.
