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## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

### Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

November 1, 1963

### CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of November 1963 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 162,063,000 lb. Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 110,150,000 lb. while dairy factories held 51,773,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 4.2 million pounds. The five year average 1958-62 of November 1 stocks is 139,217,000 lb. The October 1963 "out-of-storage" movement was 4.7 million pounds as compared with an opposite movement of 3.4 million pounds last year. Stocks of butter oil amounted to 81,598 thousand pounds.

### CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 65,410,000 lb. consisting of 65,258,000 lb. Canadian and 152,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at November 1, 1963. The summary total was higher than last year by 4.0 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 3.3 million pounds for October 1963.

### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 55,426,000 lb. which was a decrease of 5.2 million pounds from last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for October 1963 was 4.8 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 27,391,000 lb., a decrease of 31.8 million pounds from last year and 6.5 million pounds from last month.

### EGGS:

The November 1, 1963 report shows 3,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 40,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were 1,000 cases of shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 5,354,000 lb. being 1.3 million pounds lower than the 1962 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for October 1963 was 1.4 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 341 thousand pounds during October 1962.

### POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at November 1, 1963 was higher than last year by 9.5 million pounds. An "into-storage" movement of 12.4 million pounds is shown for the month of October 1963. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks, the latter in brackets, were Chicken 611,000 lb. (9,460,000) lb., Fowl 1,182,000 lb. (4,881,000) lb., and Turkey 357,000 lb. (33,448,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 25,000 lb. of poultry meat reported in transit on November 1, 1963.
