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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

DECEMBER 1, 1963

CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of December, 1963 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 150,981,000 lb. Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 103,085,000 lb. while dairy factories held 47,861,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 2.3 million pounds. The five year average 1958-62 of December 1 stocks is 128,084,000 lb. The November 1963 "out-of-storage" movement was 11.8 million pounds as compared with an opposite movement of 10.2 million pounds last year. Stocks of butter oil amounted to 78,764 thousand pounds.

CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 64,450,000 lb. consisting of 64,108,000 lb. Canadian and 342,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at December 1, 1963. The summary total was higher than last year by 10.2 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 1.1 million pounds for November, 1963.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 47,513,000 lb. which was an increase of 838 thousand pounds over last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for November 1963 was 7.9 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 22,072,000 lb., a decrease of 32.8 million pounds from last year and 5.5 million pounds from last month.

EGGS:

The December 1, 1963 report shows 3,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 37,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were 2,000 cases of shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 4,232,000 lb. being 875 thousand pounds lower than the 1962 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for November 1963 was 1.4 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 1.6 million pounds during November 1962.

POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at December 1, 1963 was higher than last year by 5.3 million pounds. An "into-storage" movement of 13.6 million pounds is shown for the month of November 1963. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks, the latter in brackets, were Chicken 585,000 lb. (10,069,000) lb., Fowl 829,000 lb. (6,190,000) lb., and Turkey 611,000 lb. (45,020,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 75,000 lb. of poultry meat reported in transit on December 1, 1963.
