Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

April 1, 1963

CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of April 1963 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 103,756,000 lb. Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 72,502,000 lb. while dairy factories held 31,149,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 25.6 million pounds. The five year average 1958-62 of April 1 stocks is 67,404,000 lb. The March 1963 "out-of-storage" movement was 9.2 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 16.3 million pounds last year.

CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 39,907,000 lb. consisting of 39,641,000 lb. Canadian and 266,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at April 1, 1963. The summary total was lower than last year by 12.4 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 3.0 million pounds for March 1963.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 13,917,000 lb. which was a decrease of 12.6 million pounds from last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for March 1963 was 6.9 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by products, skim-milk powder, amounted to 23,949,000 lb. an increase of 3.2 million pounds over last year and a decrease of 2.8 million pounds from last month.

EGGS:

The April 1, 1963 report shows 2,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 41,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were 1,000 cases shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 3,231,000 lb. being 1.6 million pounds lower than the 1962 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement of March 1963 was 951 thousand pounds as compared with an opposite movement of 9.2 thousand pounds during March 1962.

POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at April 1, 1963 was lower than last year by 1.6 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 3.6 million pounds is shown for the month of March 1963. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks the latter in brackets, were Chicken 529,000 lb. (4,926,000) lb., Fowl 451,000 lb. (1,227,000) lb. and Turkey 271,000 lb. (19,941,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 50,000 lb. of poultry meat reported in transit on April 1, 1963.
