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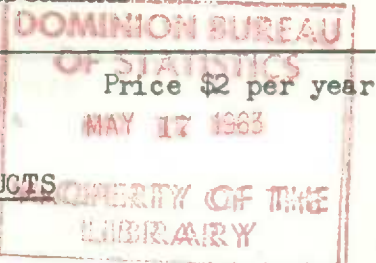

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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The first part of the report deals with the general situation of the country and the progress of the work during the year.

General Situation

The country has been very quiet during the year, and the work has been carried on in a steady and regular manner.

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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

May 1, 1963

CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of May 1963 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 100,898,000 lb. Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 71,176,000 lb. while dairy factories held 29,617,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 19.1 million pounds. The five year average 1958-62 of May 1 stocks is 69,075,000 lb. The April 1963 "out-of storage" movement was 2.1 million pounds as compared with an opposite movement of 3.6 million pounds last year.

CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 36,653,000 lb. consisting of 36,539,000 lb. Canadian and 114,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at May 1, 1963. The summary total was lower than last year by 11.6 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 3.2 million pounds for April 1963.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 15,107,000 lb. which was a decrease of 10.0 million pounds from last year. The "into-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for April 1963 was 1.0 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by products, skim-milk powder, amounted to 23,870,000 lb. an increase of 2.5 million pounds over last year and a decrease of 463 thousand pounds from last month.

EGGS:

The May 1, 1963 report shows 4,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 51,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were 1,000 cases shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 3,487,000 lb. being 1.4 million pounds lower than the 1962 figures. The "into-storage" movement for April 1963 was 61 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 18 thousand pounds during April 1962.

POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at May 1, 1963 was higher than last year by 997 thousand pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 4.4 million pounds is shown for the month of April 1963. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks the latter in brackets, were Chicken 589,000 lb. (5,865,000) lb., Fowl 305,000 lb. (1,177,000) lb. and Turkey 238,000 lb. (15,884,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 75,000 lb. of poultry meat reported in transit on May 1, 1963.
