STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

June 1, 1963

OREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of June 1963 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 107,640,000 lb. Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 75,042,000 lb. while dairy factories held 32,493,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 20.1 million pounds. The five year average 1958-62 of June 1 stocks is 78,258,000 lb. The May 1963 "into-storage" movement was 6.4 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 5.8 million pounds last year.

CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 40,729,000 lb. consisting of 40,691,000 lb. Canadian and 38,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at June 1, 1963. The summary total was lower than last year by 7.5 million pounds and showed an "into-storage" movement of 3.6 million pounds for May 1963.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 21,902,000 lb. which was a decrease of 7.1 million pounds from last year. The "into-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for May 1963 was 6.8 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by product, skim-milk powder, amounted to 25,971,000 lb. an increase of 2.2 million pounds over last year and an increase of 2.0 million pounds over last month.

EGGS:

The June 1, 1963 report shows 7,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 73,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were 2,000 cases shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 5,027,000 lb. being 667 thousand pounds lower than the 1962 figures. The "into-storage" movement for May 1963 was 1.1 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 836 thousand pounds during May 1962.

POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at June 1, 1963 was higher than last year by 886 thousand pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 3.4 million pounds is shown for the month of May 1963. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks the latter in brackets, were Chicken 561,000 lb. (5,461,000) lb., Fowl 336,000 lb. (1,584,000) lb., and Turkey 155,000 lb. (13,231,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 75,000 lb. of poultry meat reported in transit on June 1, 1963.
