STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

August 1, 1963

CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of August 1963 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 145,927,000 lb. Cold Storage Ware-houses had in store 99,977,000 lb. while dairy factories held 45,740,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 15.6 million pounds. The five year average 1958-62 of August 1 stocks is 119,248,000 lb. The July 1963 "into-storage" movement was 18.6 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 19.5 million pounds last year. Stocks of butter oil amounted to 81,651 thousand pounds.

CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 54,560,000 lb. consisting of 54,408,000 lb. Canadian and 152,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at August 1, 1963. The summary total was lower than last year by 2.5 million pounds and showed an "into-storage" movement of 6.3 million pounds for July 1963.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 46,829,000 lb. which was a decrease of 11.4 million pounds from last year. The "into-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for July 1963 was 22.8 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by product, skim milk powder, amounted to 32,358,000 lb. a decrease of 8.8 million pounds from last year and an increase of 2.6 million pounds over last month.

EGGS:

The August 1, 1963 report shows 12,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 59,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were 1,000 cases shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 7,034,000 lb. being 626 thousand pounds lower than the 1962 figures. The "into-storage" movement for July 1963 was 714 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 682 thousand pounds during July 1962.

POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at August 1, 1963 was higher than last year by 5.5 million pounds. An "intostorage" movement of 2.0 million pounds is shown for the month of July 1963. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks, the latter in brackets, were Chicken 461,000 lb. (4,950,000) lb., Fowl 401,000 lb. (2,911,000) lb., and Turkey 88,000 lb. (11,803,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 25,000 lb. of poultry meat reported in transit on August 1, 1963.
