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## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

November 1964

### Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

NOVEMBER 1, 1964

### CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of November 1964, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 122,273,000 lb. Cold storage Warehouses had in store 71,361,000 lb. while dairy factories held 50,912,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 39.6 million pounds. The five-year average 1959-63 of November 1 stocks is 148,815,000 lb. The October 1964 "out-of-storage" movement was 15.0 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 5.0 million pounds last year. Stocks of butter oil amounted to 12,916 thousand pounds.

### CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 71,331,000 lb. consisting of 70,989,000 lb. Canadian and 342,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at November 1, 1964. The summary total was higher than last year by 5.8 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 3.2 million pounds for October, 1964.

### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 55,156,000 lb. which was a decrease of 1.1 million pounds from last year. The "in-to-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for October 1964 was 1.4 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 39,697,000 lb., an increase of 12.1 million pounds over last year and a decrease of 468 thousand pounds from last month.

### EGGS:

The November 1, 1964 report shows 8,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 42,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were no cases of shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 8,177,000 lb. being 2.5 million pounds higher than the 1963 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for October, 1964 was 855 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 1.2 million pounds during October 1963.

### POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at November 1, 1964 was lower than last year by 760 thousand pounds. An "in-to-storage" movement of 12.5 million pounds is shown for the month of October, 1964. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks, the latter in brackets, were: Chicken, 451,000 lb. (7,771,000) lb., Fowl, 562,000 lb. (5,383,000) lb. and Turkey, 39,000 lb. (34,543,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 50,000 pounds of poultry meat reported in transit on November 1, 1964.
