## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

#### STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

FEBRUARY 1 1964

#### CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of February, 1964, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 124,827,000 lb. Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 83,538,000 lb. while dairy factories held 41,289,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 511 thousand pounds. The five year average 1959-63 of February 1 stocks is 103,680,000 lb. The January 1964 "out-of-storage" movement was 11.9 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 11.1 million pounds last year. Stocks of butter oil amounted to 63,721 thousand pounds.

#### CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 54,102,000 lb. consisting of 53,912,000 lb. Canadian and 190,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at February 1, 1964. The summary total was higher than last year by 7.8 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 3.6 million pounds for January, 1964.

#### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 32,268,000 lb. which was an increase of 1.3 million pounds over last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for January 1964 was 7.7 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 17,548,000 lb., a decrease of 21.6 million pounds from last year and 3.4 million pounds from last month.

#### EGGS:

The February 1, 1964 report shows 3,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 52,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were 1,000 cases of shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 4,349,000 lb. being 211 thousand pounds lower than the 1963 figures. The "in-to-storage" movement for January 1964 was 345 thousand pounds as compared with an opposite movement of 140 thousand pounds during January, 1963.

### POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at February 1, 1964 was lower than last year by 947 thousand pounds. An "in-to-storage" movement of 2.2 million pounds is shown for the month of January, 1964. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks, the latter in brackets, were: Chicken 571,000 lb. (11,587,000) lb., Fowl 787,000 lb. (6,308,000) lb., and Turkey 155,000 lb. (14,462,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were no stocks of poultry meat reported in transit on February 1, 1964.
