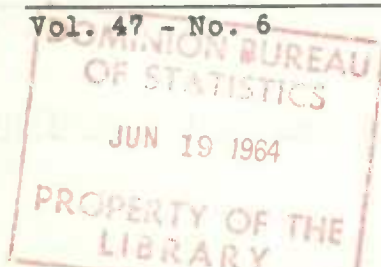
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## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

### Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

JUNE 1, 1964

### CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of June, 1964, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 104,755,000 lb. Cold storage Warehouses had in store 64,662,000 lb. while dairy factories held 40,023,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 3.5 million pounds. The five-year average 1959-63 of June 1 stocks is 90,940,000 lb. The May 1964 "in-to-storage" movement was 6.6 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 6.8 million pounds last year. Stocks of butter oil amounted to 45,320 thousand pounds.

### CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 44,565,000 lb. consisting of 44,261,000 lb. Canadian and 304,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at June 1, 1964. The summary total was higher than last year by 3.7 million pounds and showed an "in-to-storage" movement of 2.9 million pounds for May, 1964.

### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 27,603,000 lb. which was an increase of 5.7 million pounds over last year. The "in-to-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for May 1964 was 6.2 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 23,268,000 lb., a decrease of 3.2 million pounds from last year and an increase of 7.3 million pounds over last month.

### EGGS:

The June 1, 1964 report shows 10,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 71,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were no cases of shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 6,789,000 lb. being 1.5 million pounds higher than the 1963 figures. The "in-to-storage" movement for May, 1964 was 642 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 1.3 million pounds during May 1963.

### POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at June 1, 1964 was higher than last year by 3.0 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 2.6 million pounds is shown for the month of May, 1964. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks, the latter in brackets, were: Chicken, 582,000 lb. (9,369,000) lb., Fowl, 566,000 lb. (4,928,000) lb. and Turkey, 114,000 lb. (6,739,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were no stocks of poultry meat reported in transit on June 1, 1964.
