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
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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

April 1965

Source and Content



Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

April 1, 1965

CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of April 1965, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 56,370,000 lb. Cold storage Warehouses had in store 31,148,000 lb. while dairy factories held 25,117,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 43.7 million pounds. The five-year average 1960-64 of April 1 stocks is 88,217,000 lb. The March 1965 "out-of-storage" movement was 12.7 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 10.6 million pounds last year. Stocks of butter oil amounted to 5,093 thousand pounds.

CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 50,415,000 lb. consisting of 50,073,000 lb. Canadian and 342,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at April 1, 1965. The summary total was higher than last year by 1.3 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 548 thousand pounds for March, 1965.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 15,029,000 lb. which was a decrease of 7.7 million pounds from last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for March 1965 was 3.0 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 20,177,000 lb., an increase of 3.2 million pounds over last year and a decrease of 1.8 million pounds from last month.

EGGS:

The April 1, 1965 report shows 3,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 45,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were 1 thousand cases of shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 7,529,000 lb. being 1.6 million pounds higher than the 1964 figures. The "into-storage" movement for March, 1965 was 70 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 899 thousand pounds during March 1964.

POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at April 1, 1965 was higher than last year by 3.5 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 3.9 million pounds is shown for the month of March 1965. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks, the latter in brackets, were: Chicken, 481,000 lb. (9,212,000) lb., Fowl, 915,000 lb. (3,816,000) lb. and Turkey, 108,000 lb. (19,578,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 50,000 pounds of poultry meat reported in transit on April 1, 1965.
