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
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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

June 1965

Source and Content



Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

June 1, 1965

CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of June 1965, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 59,489,000 lb. Cold storage Warehouses had in store 31,853,000 lb. while dairy factories held 27,636,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 46.3 million pounds. The five-year average 1960-64 of June 1 stocks is 97,773,000 lb. The May 1965 "into-storage" movement was 6.0 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 7.2 million pounds last year. Stocks of butter oil amounted to 851 thousand pounds.

CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 51,669,000 lb. consisting of 51,137,000 lb. Canadian and 532,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at June 1, 1965. The summary total was higher than last year by 6.1 million pounds and showed an "into-storage" movement of 3.2 million pounds for May, 1965.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 19,903,000 lb. which was a decrease of 9.4 million pounds from last year. The "into-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for May, 1965 was 4.3 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 23,379,000 lb., an increase of 105 thousand pounds over last year and of 5.9 million pounds over last month.

EGGS:

The June 1, 1965 report shows 9,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 64,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were no cases of shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 7,710,000 lb. being 935 thousand pounds higher than the 1964 figures. The "into-storage" movement for May, 1965 was 718 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 608 thousand pounds during May, 1964.

POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at June 1, 1965 was lower than last year by 2.0 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 3.5 million pounds is shown for the month of May 1965. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks, the latter in brackets, were: Chicken, 515,000 lb. (8,540,000) lb., Fowl, 442,000 lb. (2,872,000) lb. and Turkey, 44,000 lb. (11,077,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 50,000 pounds of poultry meat reported in transit on June 1, 1965.
