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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

AUGUST 1965

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Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold-storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.



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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

August 1, 1965

CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of August 1965, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 92,709,000 lb. Cold storage Warehouses had in store 50,382,000 lb. while dairy factories held 42,222,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 38.1 million pounds. The five-year average 1960-64 of August 1 stocks is 135,037,000 lb. The July 1965 "into-storage" movement was 15.4 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 8.3 million pounds last year. Stocks of butter oil amounted to 731 thousand pounds.

CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 65,079,000 lb. consisting of 64,965,000 lb. Canadian and 114,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at August 1, 1965. The summary total was higher than last year by 2.9 million pounds and showed an "into-storage" movement of 3.8 million pounds for July, 1965.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 50,542,000 lb. which was a decrease of 4.8 million pounds from last year. The "into-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for July, 1965 was 12.0 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 39,397,000 lb., an increase of 3.8 million pounds over last year and of 6.2 million pounds over last month.

EGGS:

The August 1, 1965 report shows 13,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 52,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were 1 thousand cases of shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 8,961,000 lb. being 696 thousand pounds lower than the 1964 figures. The "into-storage" movement for July, 1965 was 75 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 1.3 million pounds during July, 1964.

POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at August 1, 1965 was lower than last year by 4.3 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 125 thousand pounds is shown for the month of July 1965. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks, the latter in brackets, were: Chicken, 399,000 lb. (7,085,000) lb., Fowl, 334,000 lb. (2,597,000) lb. and Turkey, 29,000 lb. (9,607,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 125,000 pounds of poultry meat reported in transit on August 1, 1965.
