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
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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

September 1965

Source and Content



Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi-public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

September 1, 1965

CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of September 1965, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 101,545,000 lb. Cold storage Warehouses had in store 55,334,000 lb. while dairy factories held 46,141,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 34.9 million pounds. The five-year average 1960-64 of September 1 stocks is 145,989,000 lb. The August 1965 "into-storage" movement was 7.6 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 5.6 million pounds last year. Stocks of butter oil amounted to 763 thousand pounds.

CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 72,499,000 lb. consisting of Canadian cheese only. There were no stocks reported in transit and no imported stocks on hand at September 1, 1965. The summary total was higher than last year by 3.1 million pounds and showed an "into-storage" movement of 6.9 million pounds for August, 1965.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 56,422,000 lb. which was an increase of 1.7 million pounds over last year. The "into-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for August, 1965 was 5.9 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 43,956,000 lb., an increase of 5.5 million pounds over last year and of 4.1 million pounds over last month.

EGGS:

The September 1, 1965 report shows 6,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 48,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were no cases of shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 9,997,000 lb. being 305 thousand pounds higher than the 1964 figures. The "into-storage" movement for August, 1965 was 866 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 35 thousand pounds during August, 1964.

POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at September 1, 1965 was lower than last year by 2.3 million pounds. An "into-storage" movement of 6.1 million pounds is shown for the month of August, 1965. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks, the latter in brackets, were: Chicken, 392,000 lb. (7,359,000) lb., Fowl, 379,000 lb. (2,896,000) lb. and Turkey, 55,000 lb. (14,560,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 25,000 pounds of poultry meat reported in transit on September 1, 1965.
