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
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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

January 1966

Source and Content



Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

JANUARY 1, 1966

CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of January 1966, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 74,715,000 lb. Cold storage Warehouses had in store 36,691,000 lb. while dairy factories held 37,919,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 18.2 million pounds. The five-year average 1961-65 of January 1 stocks is 121,033,000 lb. The December 1965 "out-of-storage" movement was 15.8 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 16.4 million pounds last year. Stocks of butter oil amounted to 449 thousand pounds.

CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 61,394,000 lb. consisting of 61,356,000 lb. Canadian and 38,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at January 1, 1966. The summary total was higher than last year by 2.9 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 4.6 million pounds for December, 1965.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 39,814,000 lb. which was an increase of 3.8 million pounds over last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for December, 1965 was 7.6 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 25,554,000 lb., a decrease of 2.9 million pounds from last year and of 7.5 million pounds from last month.

EGGS:

The January 1, 1966 report shows 2,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 58,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were no cases of shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 4,353,000 lb. being 2.5 million pounds less than the 1965 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for December, 1965 was 1.1 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 476 thousand pounds during December, 1964.

POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at January 1, 1966 was lower than last year by 564 thousand pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 29.5 million pounds is shown for the month of December, 1965. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks, the latter in brackets, were: Chicken, 300,000 lb. (8,905,000) lb., Fowl, 311,000 lb. (4,335,000) lb. and Turkey, 81,000 lb. (22,606,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 50,000 pounds of poultry meat reported in transit on January 1, 1966.
