# STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

October 1966

Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

# STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

October 1, 1966

## CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of October 1966, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 85,683,000 lb. Cold storage Warehouses had in store 40,218,000 lb. while dairy factories held 45,430,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 22.4 million pounds. The five-year average 1961-65 of October 1 stocks is 145,192,000 lb. The September 1966 "in-to-storage" movement was 1.8 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 4.0 million pounds last year. Stocks of butter oil amounted to 72 thousand pounds.

### CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 71,651,000 lb. consisting of 71,613,000 lb. Canadian and 38,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at October 1, 1966. The summary total was lower than last year by 1.5 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage movement of 3.3 million pounds for September 1966.

### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 56,081,000 lb. which was a decrease of 590 thousand pounds from last year. The "in-to-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for September, 1966 was 1.6 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 83,593,000 lb., an increase of 34.2 million pounds over last year and of 5.3 million pounds over last month.

#### EGGS:

The October 1, 1966 report shows 2,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 46,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were no cases of shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 3,586,000 lb. being 5.4 million pounds less than the 1965 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for September, 1966 was 501 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 1.1 million pounds during September 1965.

#### POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at October 1, 1966 was higher than last year by 5.1 million pounds. An "in-to-storage" movement of 12.6 million pounds is shown for the month of September, 1966. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks, the latter in brackets, were: Chicken, 201,000 lb. (9,817,000) lb., Fowl, 202,000 lb. (2,687,000) lb. and Turkey, 29,000 lb. (30,442,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 175,000 lb. of poultry meat reported in transit on October 1, 1966.
