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
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## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

December 1966

Source and Content



Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

December 1, 1966

### CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of December 1966, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 72,903,000 lb. Cold storage Warehouses had in store 37,601,000 lb. while dairy factories held 35,232,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 17.4 million pounds. The five-year average 1961-65 of December 1 stocks is 128,635,000 lb. The November 1966 "out-of-storage" movement was 10.4 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 12.6 million pounds last year. Stocks of butter oil amounted to 9 thousand pounds.

### CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 76,104,000 lb. Canadian. There were no stocks reported in transit and no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at December 1, 1966. The summary total was higher than last year by 10.1 million pounds and showed an "into-storage" movement of 806 thousand pounds for November, 1966.

### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 45,180,000 lb. which was a decrease of 2.3 million pounds from last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for November, 1966 was 8.1 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 77,611,000 lb., an increase of 44.5 million pounds over last year and a decrease of 2.2 million pounds from last month.

### EGGS:

The December 1, 1966 report shows 3,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 50,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were one thousand cases of shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 2,808,000 lb. being 2.8 million pounds less than the 1965 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for November, 1966 was 143 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 1.6 million pounds during November 1965.

### POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at December 1, 1966 was higher than last year by 11.4 million pounds. An "in-to-storage" movement of 18.2 million pounds is shown for the month of November, 1966. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks, the latter in brackets, were: Chicken, 438,000 lb. (13,435,000) lb., Fowl, 611,000 lb. (3,535,000) lb. and Turkey, 43,000 lb. (57,975,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 125,000 lb. of poultry meat reported in transit on December 1, 1966.
