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
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## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

June 1966  
Source and Content



Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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DEFENSE INFORMATION

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## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

June 1, 1966

### CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of June 1966, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 41,179,000 lb. Cold storage Warehouses had in store 17,844,000 lb. while dairy factories held 23,300,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 20.2 million pounds. The five-year average 1961-65 of June 1 stocks is 91,780,000 lb. The May 1966 "in-to-storage" movement was 6.3 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 8.2 million pounds last year. Stocks of butter oil amounted to 100 thousand pounds.

### CHEESE

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 59,199,000 lb. consisting of 59,123,000 lb. Canadian and 76,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at June 1, 1966. The summary total was higher than last year by 7.1 million pounds and showed an "in-to-storage" movement of 5.8 million pounds for May, 1966.

### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 26,817,000 lb. which was an increase of 6.9 million pounds over last year. The "in-to-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for May, 1966 was 6.0 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 38,599,000 lb., an increase of 14.8 million pounds over last year and of 12.0 million pounds over last month.

### EGGS:

The June 1, 1966 report shows 9,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 62,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were 540 cases of shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 3,238,000 lb. being 4.5 million pounds less than the 1965 figures. The "in-to-storage" movement for May, 1966 was 556 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 729 thousand pounds during May, 1965.

### POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at June 1, 1966 was lower than last year by 791 thousand pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 5.2 million pounds is shown for the month of May, 1966. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks, the latter in brackets, were: Chicken, 216,000 lb. (7,460,000) lb., Fowl, 111,000 lb. (1,708,000) lb. and Turkey, 117,000 lb. (14,771,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were no stocks of poultry meat reported in transit on June 1, 1966.
