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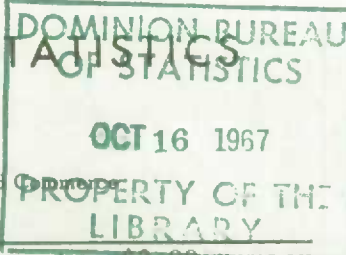

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

October 1967

Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

October 1, 1967

CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of October 1967, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 83,301,000 lb. Cold storage warehouses had in store 49,039,000 lb. while dairy factories held 34,227,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 3.0 million pounds. The five-year average 1962-66 of October 1 stocks is 130,837,000 lb. The September 1967 "in-to-storage" movement was 7.2 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 4.0 million pounds last year.

CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 86,808,000 lb. consisting of 86,770,000 lb. Canadian and 38,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at October 1, 1967. The summary total was higher than last year by 2.6 million pounds and showed an "in-to-storage" movement of 3.6 million pounds for September, 1967.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 43,247,000 lb. which was a decrease of 12.9 million pounds from last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for September, 1967 was 4.8 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 117,205,000 lb., an increase of 33.7 million pounds over last year and an increase of 16.9 million pounds over last month.

EGGS:

The October 1, 1967 report shows 9,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 72,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were no shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 9,170,000 lb. being 5.3 million pounds higher than the 1966 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for September, 1967 was 335 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 570 thousand pounds during September, 1966.

POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at October 1, 1967 was higher than last year by 11.6 million pounds. An "in-to-storage" movement of 6.9 million pounds is shown for the month of September, 1967. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks, the latter in brackets, were: Chicken 457,000 lb. (14,531,000) lb., Fowl, 321,000 lb. (6,985,000) lb. and Turkey, 19,000 lb. (35,491,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 50,000 lb. of poultry meat reported in transit on October 1, 1967.
