Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

November 1, 1967

CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of November 1967, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 81,770,000 lb. Cold storage warehouses had in store 48,251,000 lb. while dairy factories held 33,519,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 1.6 million pounds. The five-year average 1962-66 of November 1 stocks is 125,522,000 lb. The October 1967 "out-of-storage" movement was 2.1 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 2.9 million pounds last year.

CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 95,500,000 lb. Canadian. There were no stocks reported in transit and no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at November 1, 1967. The summary total was higher than last year by 12.4 million pounds and showed an "in-to-storage" movement of 2.3 million pounds for October, 1967.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 40,740,000 lb. which was a decrease of 12.5 million pounds from last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for October, 1967 was 2.5 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 132,604,000 lb., an increase of 52.0 million pounds over last year and an increase of 11.0 million pounds over last month.

EGGS:

The November 1, 1967 report shows 6,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 80,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were no shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 8,347,000 lb. being 5.3 million pounds higher than the 1966 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for October, 1967 was 1.0 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 762 thousand pounds during October, 1966.

POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at November 1, 1967 was higher than last year by 10.7 million pounds. An "in-to-storage" movement of 11.5 million pounds is shown for the month of October, 1967. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks, the latter in brackets, were: Chicken 341,000 lb. (14,069,000) lb., Fowl, 406,000 lb. (6,501,000) lb. and Turkey, 46,000 lb. (50,274,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were no stocks of poultry meat reported in transit on November 1, 1967.
