December 1967

Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

December 1, 1967

### CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of December 1967, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 70,160,000 lb. Cold storage warehouses had in store 41,591,000 lb. while dairy factories held 28,394,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 2.8 million pounds. The five-year average 1962-66 of December 1 stocks is 114,521,000 lb. The November 1967 "out-of-storage" movement was 10.9 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 10.4 million pounds last year.

### CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 95,872,000 lb. consisting of 95,834,000 lb. Canadian and 38,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at December 1, 1967. The summary total was higher than last year by 12.9 million pounds and showed an "in-to-storage" movement of 575 thousand pounds for November, 1967.

### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 34,902,000 lb. which was a decrease of 11.4 million pounds from last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for November, 1967 was 5.8 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 137,966,000 lb., an increase of 60.8 million pounds over last year and an increase of 813 thousand pounds over last month.

### EGGS:

The December 1, 1967 report shows 5,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 75,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were 1,000 cases of shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 8,597,000 lb. being 5.7 million pounds higher than the 1966 figures. The "in-to-storage" movement for November, 1967 was 371 thousand pounds as compared with an opposite movement of 155 thousand pounds during November, 1966.

### POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at December 1, 1967 was lower than last year by 2.0 million pounds. An "in-to-storage" movement of 7.7 million pounds is shown for the month of November, 1967. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks, the latter in brackets, were: Chicken, 372,000 lb. (12,279,000) lb., Fowl, 436,000 lb. (5,967,000) lb. and Turkey, 57,000 lb. (60,593,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 325,000 lb. of poultry meat reported in transit on December 1, 1967.
