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
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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

Source and Content



Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of April 1967, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 27,588,000 lb. Cold storage warehouses had in store 14,044,000 lb. while dairy factories held 13,544,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 6.0 million pounds. The five-year average 1962-66 of April 1 stocks is 74,187,000 lb. The March 1967 "out-of-storage" movement was 10.6 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 12.4 million pounds last year.

CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 63,084,000 lb. consisting of 63,008,000 lb. Canadian and 76,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at April 1, 1967. The summary total was higher than last year by 5.0 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 9.0 million pounds for March, 1967.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 23,149,000 lb. which was an increase of 8.2 million pounds over last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for March, 1967 was 5.9 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 23,323,000 lb., an increase of 5.2 million pounds over last year and a decrease of 7.1 million pounds from last month.

EGGS:

The April 1, 1967 report shows 5,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 61,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were 1,000 cases of shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 5,138,000 lb. being 1.8 million pounds higher than the 1966 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for March, 1967 was 169 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 912 thousand pounds during March, 1966.

POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at April 1, 1967 was higher than last year by 19.7 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 2.1 million pounds is shown for the month of March, 1967. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks, the latter in brackets, were: Chicken, 359,000 lb. (20,920,000) lb., Fowl, 426,000 lb. (5,333,000) lb. and Turkey, 51,000 lb. (25,026,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 75,000 lb. of poultry meat reported in transit on April 1, 1967.
