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## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

May 1967

### Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.


Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

May 1, 1967

CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of May 1967, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 27,298,000 lb. Cold storage warehouses had in store 12,680,000 lb. while dairy factories held 14,548,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 7.9 million pounds. The five-year average 1962-66 of May 1 stocks is 74,054,000 lb. The April 1967 "in-to-storage" movement was 373 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 1.6 million pounds last year.

CHEEDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 62,105,000 lb. consisting of 62,029,000 lb. Canadian and 76,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at May 1, 1967. The summary total was higher than last year by 7.6 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 1.8 million pounds for April, 1967.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 13,518,000 lb. which was a decrease of 7.3 million pounds from last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for April, 1967 was 9.6 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 23,152,000 lb., a decrease of 4.2 million pounds from last year and an increase of 1.2 million pounds over last month.

EGGS:

The May 1, 1967 report shows 5,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 71,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were 1,000 cases of shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 5,064,000 lb. being 2.4 million pounds higher than the 1966 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for April, 1967 was 195 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 626 thousand pounds during April, 1966.

POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at May 1, 1967 was higher than last year by 20.8 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 2.2 million pounds is shown for the month of April, 1967. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks, the latter in brackets, were: Chicken, 404,000 lb. (20,007,000) lb., Fowl, 257,000 lb. (5,527,000) lb. and Turkey, 217,000 lb. (21,461,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 50,000 lb. of poultry meat reported in transit on May 1, 1967.
