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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

July 1967

Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.



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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

July 1, 1967

CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of July 1967, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 47,406,000 lb. Cold storage warehouses had in store 25,872,000 lb. while dairy factories held 21,499,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 10.2 million pounds. The five-year average 1962-66 of July 1 stocks is 99,674,000 lb. The June 1967 "in-to-storage" movement was 13.9 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 17.0 million pounds last year.

CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 72,738,000 lb. consisting of 72,700,000 lb. Canadian and 38,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at July 1, 1967. The summary total was higher than last year by 698 thousand pounds and showed an "in-to-storage" movement of 9.8 million pounds for June, 1967.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 33,918,000 lb. which was a decrease of 5.4 million pounds from last year. The "in-to-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for June, 1967 was 8.9 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 53,717,000 lb., a decrease of 1.6 million pounds from last year and an increase of 21.4 million pounds over last month.

EGGS:

The July 1, 1967 report shows 20,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 85,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were 1,000 cases of shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 6,249,000 lb. being 2.4 million pounds higher than the 1966 figures. The "in-to-storage" movement for June, 1967 was 654 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 525 thousand pounds during June, 1966.

POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at July 1, 1967 was higher than last year by 22.7 million pounds. An "in-to-storage" movement of 286 thousand pounds is shown for the month of June, 1967. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks, the latter in brackets, were: Chicken, 465,000 lb. (20,183,000) lb., Fowl, 309,000 lb. (5,662,000) lb. and Turkey, 118,000 lb. (17,092,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received on time. There were 50,000 lb. of poultry meat reported in transit on July 1, 1967.
