Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

January 1, 1968

CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of January 1968, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 58,076,000 lb. Cold storage warehouses had in store 32,974,000 lb. while dairy factories held 25,032,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 3.2 million pounds. The five-year average 1963-67 of January 1 stocks is 100,243,000 lb. The December 1967 "out-of-storage" movement was 12.8 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 11.8 million pounds last year.

CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 89,646,000 lb. Canadian. There were no stocks reported in transit and no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at January 1, 1968. The summary total was higher than last year by 8.4 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 6.0 million pounds for December 1967.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 32,040,000 lb. which was a decrease of 9.0 million pounds from last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for December, 1967 was 2.9 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 137,786,000 lb., an increase of 81.9 million pounds over last year and an increase of 1.3 million pounds over last month.

EGGS:

The January 1, 1968 report shows 4,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 73,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were no shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 7,143,000 lb. being 4.2 million pounds higher than the 1967 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for December, 1967 was 1.3 million pounds as compared with an opposite movement of 18 thousand pounds during December, 1966.

POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at January 1, 1968 was higher than last year by 1.0 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 31.2 million pounds is shown for the month of December, 1967. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks, the latter in brackets, were: Chicken, 185,000 lb. (13,871,000) lb., Fowl, 421,000 lb. (6,410,000) lb. and Turkey, 116,000 lb. (32,799,000) lb. There were 25,000 lb. of poultry meat reported in transit on January 1, 1968.
