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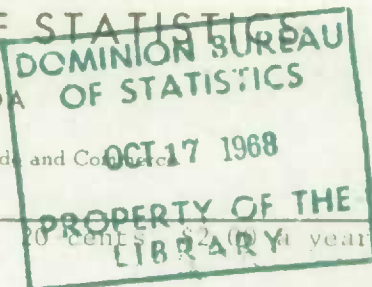
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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

OCTOBER 1968

Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

Excludes stocks in transit after July 1, 1968.

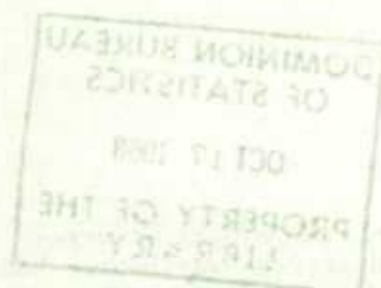

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1. The purpose of this report is to provide a summary of the results of the survey of the economic conditions of the provinces and territories of Canada for the year 1967.

2. The survey was conducted by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics and the results are presented in this report.

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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

OCTOBER 1, 1968

Creamery butter

At the opening of the first business day of October 1968, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 76,308,000 lb. Cold storage warehouses had in store 44,750,000 lb. while dairy factories held 31,558,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 8.2 million pounds. The five-year average 1963-67 of October 1 stocks is 116,653,000 lb. The September 1968 "in-to-storage" movement was 6.6 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 8.3 million pounds last year.

Cheddar cheese

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 101,283,000 lb. Canadian. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at October 1, 1968. The summary total was higher than last year by 8.3 million pounds and showed an "in-to-storage" movement of 2.6 million pounds for September 1968.

Concentrated milk products

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 43,091,000 lb. which was a decrease of 155 thousand pounds from last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for September 1968 was 6.0 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 235,337,000 lb., an increase of 113.0 million pounds over last year and a decrease of 5.7 million pounds from last month.

Eggs

The October 1, 1968 report shows 1,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 76,000 cases of fresh eggs. Frozen eggs totalled 6,901,000 lb. being 3.1 million pounds lower than the 1967 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for September 1968 was 402 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 443 thousand pounds during September 1967.

Poultry meat

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at October 1, 1968 was higher than last year by 645 thousand pounds. An "in-to-storage" movement of 13.7 million pounds is shown for the month of September 1968. By kind, the stocks were: Chicken, 11,583,000 lb., Fowl, 3,105,000 lb., Turkey, 49,065,000 lb., Duck, 797,000 lb. and Goose, 10,000 lb.
