

February 1968

Source and Content



Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

February 1, 1968

CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of February 1968, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 45,856,000 lb. Cold storage warehouses had in store 24,361,000 lb. while dairy factories held 21,460,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 3.8 million pounds. The five-year average 1963-67 of February 1 stocks is 88,784,000 lb. The January 1968 "out-of-storage" movement was 11.4 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 11.5 million pounds last year.

CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 80,021,000 lb. consisting of 79,983,000 lb. Canadian and 38,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at February 1, 1968. The summary total was higher than last year by 2.5 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 8.6 million pounds for January 1968.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 23,663,000 lb. which was a decrease of 6.0 million pounds from last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for January, 1968 was 8.4 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 133,461,000 lb., an increase of 87.6 million pounds over last year and a decrease of 4.0 million pounds from last month.

EGGS:

The February 1, 1968 report shows 13,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 81,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were 1,000 cases of shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 7,065,000 lb. being 2.7 million pounds higher than the 1967 figures. The "in-to-storage" movement for January, 1968 was 37 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 1.4 million pounds during January, 1967.

POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at February 1, 1968 was lower than last year by 5.5 million pounds. An "in-to-storage" movement of 357 thousand pounds is shown for the month of January, 1968. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks, the latter in brackets, were: Chicken, 27,000 lb. (13,064,000) lb., Fowl, 288,000 lb. (5,391,000) lb. and Turkey, 92,000 lb. (33,817,000) lb. There were 25,000 lb. of poultry meat reported in transit on February 1, 1968.
