Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

March 1, 1968

CREAMERY BUTTER:

At the opening of the first business day of March 1968, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 28,168,000 lb. Cold storage warehouses had in store 13,928,000 lb. while dairy factories held 14,170,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 9.9 million pounds. The five-year average 1963-67 of March 1 stocks is 75,331,000 lb. The February 1968 "out-of-storage" movement was 15.7 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 11.6 million pounds last year.

CHEDDAR CHEESE:

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 75,989,000 lb. consisting of 75,799,000 lb. Canadian and 190,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at March 1, 1968. The summary total was higher than last year by 2.0 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 3.8 million pounds for February 1968.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 13,737,000 lb. which was a decrease of 15.3 million pounds from last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for February, 1968 was 9.9 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 129,648,000 lb., an increase of 99.7 million pounds over last year and a decrease of 3.2 million pounds from last month.

EGGS:

The March 1, 1968 report shows 3,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 79,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were 1,000 cases of shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 6,843,000 lb. being 1.2 million pounds higher than the 1967 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for February, 1968 was 221 thousand pounds as compared with an opposite movement of 1.2 million pounds during February, 1967.

POULTRY MEAT:

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at March 1, 1968 was lower than last year by 5.7 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 4.0 million pounds is shown for the month of February, 1968. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks, the latter in brackets, were: Chicken, 31,000 lb. (11,747,000) lb., Fowl, 299,000 lb. (5,278,000) lb. and Turkey, 80,000 lb. (32,220,000) lb. There were 50,000 lb. of poultry meat reported in transit on March 1, 1968.
