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
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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

May 1968

Source and Content



Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.



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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

MAY 1, 1968

Creamery butter

At the opening of the first business day of May 1968, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 17,309,000 lbs. Cold storage warehouses had in store 7,798,000 lb. while dairy factories held 9,441,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 11.3 million pounds. The five-year average 1963-67 of May 1 stocks is 63,414,000 lb. The April 1968 "out-of-storage" movement was 1.8 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 1.5 million pounds last year.

Cheddar cheese

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 69,220,000 lb. Canadian. There were no stocks reported in transit and no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at May 1, 1968. The summary total was higher than last year by 3.3 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 2.0 million pounds for April 1968.

Concentrated milk products

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 17,961,000 lb. which was an increase of 4.5 million pounds over last year. The "in-to-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for April, 1968 was 3.7 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 138,536,000 lb., an increase of 113.5 million pounds over last year and an increase of 7.7 million pounds over last month.

Eggs

The May 1, 1968 report shows 3,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 80,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were no shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 6,334,000 lb. being 1.0 million pounds higher than the 1967 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for April, 1968 was 734 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 441 thousand pounds during April, 1967.

Poultry meat

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at May 1, 1968 was lower than last year by 10.6 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 5.4 million pounds is shown for the month of April, 1968. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks, the latter in brackets, were: Chicken, 34,000 lb. (12,460,000) lb., Fowl, 271,000 lb. (3,342,000) lb. and Turkey, 18,000 lb. (25,865,000) lb. There were 50,000 lb. of poultry meat reported in transit on May 1, 1968.
