### Source and Content

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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

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## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

JUNE 1, 1968

### Creamery butter

At the opening of the first business day of June 1968, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 24,123,000 lb. Cold storage warehouses had in store 12,183,000 lb. while dairy factories held 11,905,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 10.3 million pounds. The five-year average 1963-67 of June 1 stocks is 70,094,000 lb. The May 1968 "in-to-storage" movement was 6.1 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 5.8 million pounds last year.

### Cheddar cheese

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 70,198,000 lb. Canadian. There were no stocks reported in transit and no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at June 1, 1968. The summary total was higher than last year by 3.5 million pounds and showed an "in-to-storage" movement of 547 thousand pounds for May 1968.

### Concentrated milk products

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 23,537,000 lb. which was a decrease of 1.4 million pounds from last year. The "in-to-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for May, 1968 was 5.6 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 152,610,000 lb., an increase of 119.8 million pounds over last year and an increase of 12.5 million pounds over last month.

### Eggs

The June 1, 1968 report shows 2,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 88,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were no shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 6,346,000 lb. being 84 thousand pounds lower than the 1967 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for May, 1968 was 6 thousand pounds as compared with an opposite movement of 1.1 million pounds during May, 1967.

### Poultry meat

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at June 1, 1968 was lower than last year by 10.1 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 2.2 million pounds is shown for the month of May, 1968. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks, the latter in brackets, were: Chicken, 23,000 lb. (10,652,000) lb., Fowl, 217,000 lb. (3,180,000) lb. and Turkey, 23,000 lb. (22,952,000) lb. There were 50,000 lb. of poultry meat reported in transit on June 1, 1968.
