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Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

JULY 1, 1968

Creamery butter

At the opening of the first business day of July 1968, the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 42,244,000 lb. Cold storage warehouses had in store 21,837,000 lb. while dairy factories held 20,407,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 7.6 million pounds. The five-year average 1963-67 of July 1 stocks is 87,461,000 lb. The June 1968 "in-to-storage" movement was 17.4 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 15.4 million pounds last year.

Cheddar cheese

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 83,995,000 lb. consisting of 83,957,000 lb. Canadian and 38,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand at July 1, 1968. The summary total was higher than last year by 7.2 million pounds and showed an "in-to-storage" movement of 13.3 million pounds for June 1968.

Concentrated milk products

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 37,583,000 lb. which was an increase of 3.7 million pounds over last year. The "in-to-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for June 1968 was 14.0 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim milk powder, amounted to 187,634,000 lb., an increase of 131.5 million pounds over last year and an increase of 33.7 million pounds over last month.

Eggs

The July 1, 1968 report shows 2,000 cases of cold storage eggs and 79,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were 2,000 cases of shell eggs reported in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 8,079,000 lb. being 133 thousand pounds lower than the 1967 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for June, 1968 was 1.8 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 1.8 million pounds during June 1967.

Poultry meat

The summary total of dressed and eviscerated poultry meat stocks at July 1, 1968 was lower than last year by 12.6 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 2.9 million pounds is shown for the month of June 1968. By kind, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stocks, the latter in brackets, were: Chicken, 17,000 lb. (10,020,000) lb., Fowl, 188,000 lb. (3,348,000) lb. and Turkey, 2,000 lb. (20,775,000) lb. There were 25,000 lb. of poultry meat reported in transit on July 1, 1968.
